Business Arising from Last Meeting

City of Brampton Swim to Survive Inquiry: at the November 20 meeting, a parent inquired about St. Rita students participating in the city's swim to survive classes.

- -Staff provided input on how this activity was run in the past. They identified 3 challenges: lack of privacy in the public change room; bussing issues (bus schedule for pickup/drop off meant there was limited time in the pool for the students); students were not comfortable changing in front of their peers.
- -Outcome: The school has decided not to go ahead with this activity.
- -Permission form for sports tryouts: at the November 20 meeting, a parent inquired if permission

forms for sport tryouts could be done digitally.

- -Mr. Quartarone provided clarification on this issue. The board policy is to make sure paper copies of important documents such as permission forms are housed in the office for a set number of years. Paper copies are required.
- -Outcome: The school will continue with providing paper copies of permission forms to students and parents.

Chair Report

Treasurer's Report (LeeAnn Chng)

- Parent engagement fund deposited (\$500).
- Expenses: Some items close to or slightly over budget: families in need, clubs.
- The Wellness Day had an average of approximately \$20. Council to vote to apply additional funds to cover this extra cost.

Principal's Report (Mrs. Vieira and Mr. Quartarone)

School Updates

- Window into Learning communication has been launched. Teachers can share all of the great things that are happening in their classroom with parents. This is a great opportunity to encourage more conservation about your child's school day, what they have been learning, and upcoming events.
- Upcoming guest speakers:
 - Sewing Studio: January 30 and 31, 2025
 - African Drumming (February 5): The focus of this group is a message of unity and togetherness.
- Acadience screeners have been done for students in FDK to Grade 2. This assessment will help identify students who are at risk and/or do not meet reading benchmarks for their age. Staff will

- use this data to create focus groups for reading intervention and support.
- DPCDSB is rolling out a new technology plan. The board will now provide and maintain technology for students in all schools. The number of chromebooks and computers available in the school is based on specific ratios for each division.
- Invitational tournaments: For the rest of the year, students participating in invitational tournaments will be responsible for paying any extra or outstanding tournament fees (such as the entry fee). The amount per student will be capped at \$30.
- St Rita school will be transferring all bank accounts to CIBC Bank in the coming weeks.
- Now that the school board is taking over for the technology in the school (see above), the money allocated in the council budget for technology can no longer be used for this purpose. This money will need to be reallocated. Council had initially allotted \$15 000 for this purpose.
 - o Motion put forward to reallocate \$15000. The following areas of need were identified:
 - \$750- families in need in our school community
 - \$100- the origami club
 - \$2900- classroom enhancement (29 teachers x \$100 each teacher)
 - \$20.67- Wellness Day additional fees
 - \$2000- graduation award wall
 - \$1000- guest speakers
 - \$1000- invitational tournaments
 - Motion passed and carried

Catholic School Improvement Learning Cycles- St. Rita continues to work towards improvement in the following 5 areas: Believe, Respect, Excel, Thrive, and Trust.

- The Catholic School Learning Improvement Plan is a 3 year cycle. This year's plan has now been finalized. These above areas will continue to be developed throughout the school year.
